

HANDLIST OF JAPANESE MANUSCRIPTS ACQUIRED SINCE 1984

The following list includes all Japanese-language manuscripts acquired by Asia, Pacific and Africa Collections (APAC) and its predecessors since 1984. It also includes a small number of manuscripts written in Chinese by Japanese authors and several woodblocks.

Details of earlier Japanese manuscript acquisitions can be found in the *List of Oriental Manuscripts* (arranged by shelfmark) and the *Classified Inventory of Oriental Manuscripts* (arranged by language), both of which are kept on the references shelves in the OIOC Reading Room. Kawase Kazuma's *Daiei Toshokan shozō wakansho sōmokuroku (Catalogue of early books in the British Library)* (ORC JAP 4) includes manuscripts in the APAC written before 1868. The descriptions of the manuscripts are mixed in with those of printed books but there is an index (in Japanese script) of manuscripts at the back. Manuscripts acquired before 1904 also appear in the 2 volumes of R K Douglas's *Catalogue of Printed Books and Manuscripts in the Library of the British Museum* (ORC JAP 1 & 2).

Or.14192 *Shikitei Sanba gibun no maki* 四季亭三馬戯文卷

Humorous writings by Shikitei Sanba 四季(式)亭三馬 (1776-1822). 1821 [Bunsei 4]. 1 scroll 17.5x172 cm. Decorated with hand-painted tree designs. Acquired 29 Mar 1984.

Or.14193 *Nori no e sōshi* 法の絵草紙

Illustrated novel on Buddhist theme. By Muzenshi 無慚子 (fl. 1784). Late 18th century. 3 volumes. 22.5x16.5 cm. *Fukurotoji* binding in original paper covers. Acquired March 1984.

Or.14224 *Torioi O-Matsu kajō shinwa* 鳥追阿松海上新話

Illustrated manuscript for the 2nd volume of the novel *Torioi O-Matsu kajō shinwa* by Kubota Hikosaku 久保田彦作 first published in 1878. c.1877. 56 pages. 17x12.5 cm. Acquired June 1984.

Or.14302 *Ōta Nanpo jihitsu kyōka kaishi* 大田南畝自筆狂歌懷紙

Kyōka poem by Ōta Nanpo 大田南畝 (1749-1823) from the anthology *Banshi senkō* 万紫千紅. Text reads: *E o wataru haru wa umekawa aoyanagi ni fune sashiyosete iruru mi-sakana* [signed] *Daku Sanjin* 江をわたる 春ハ梅川 青柳に 舟さしよせて いるるみさかな 蜀山人. Edo, 1817. 1 sheet 35.5x42.7 cm, mounted in Japanese-style frame 53.7x64.2 cm. Acquired June 1985.

Or.14303 *Yuki yande ki wa mokushi tori tonde umi hitori nareri* 雪止んで木は黙し鳥飛んで海独り鳴れり

Poem in *sōsho* style calligraphy by Ogawa Mimei 小川未明 (1882-1961), novelist and author of fairy tales. c.1930s. 1 sheet 27x23.5 cm. Mounted as a hanging scroll. Acquired June 1985.

Or.14304 *Jūgyūzu chūkai* 十牛図注解

Commentary on the Ten Ox-Herding Pictures, a frequent theme of Zen works. Mid 16th century. 20 folios. 27.8x20cm. Manuscript with woodblock-printed hand-coloured illustrations. Paper decorated with mica. Acquired July 1985.

Or.14305 [*Ōmi hakkei wakachō* 近江八景和歌帳]

Album of *waka* poems on the eight famous views of Ōmi by leading court nobles including Kanpaku Konoe Iehisa 近衛家久 (1687-1737). Compiled 1733-1736. Folding album with 4 leaves. 30x27cm Folios heavily gilded. Each of the 8 poems written in ink on paper decorated with “mist and cloud” pattern in gold. Tosa-style landscape paintings by the court painter Tosa Mitsuyoshi 土佐光芳 (1700-1772) on inside of front and back covers. Bound in silk brocade. Acquired November 1985.

Or. 14310 *Yamagata Dekisho shoga kan* 山縣適處書画卷

Series of *kanshi* (Chinese poems) and ink illustrations of famous sights in Japan by the poet Yamagata Dekisho 山縣適處 (1837-1906). 1902. 2 scrolls each 14.5x200 cm. Acquired March 1986.

Or.14311 [*Calligraphy by Kaneko Ōtei*]

Eights sheets of calligraphy by the Kaneko Ōtei (1906-2001) based on Han dynasty woodslips in the Stein Collection (Or.8211). Donated April 1986.

Or.14404 [*Miscellany of antiquities*]

Illustrated miscellany of Japanese antiquities and curiosities ranging in date from the 6th to early 19th centuries. Anonymous. c. mid 19th century. 1 scroll 22 cm (trimmed) x 1490 cm. Coloured illustrations. Acquired April 1988.

Or.14463 *Higashiyama hanami no ki* 東山花見之記

Account of cherry blossom viewing at Higashiyama near Kyoto by the poet and *haiga* artist Hinaya (Nonoguchi) Ryūho 雛屋(野々口)立圃 (1595-1669). Kyoto: 1658 [Manji 1]. 1 scroll 26x470 cm composed of 10 different coloured and decorated papers. Green brocade cover. Acquired October 1988.

Or.14476 *Senshindō zushi* 専心堂図誌

Pictorial record of a poetry meeting held at the Senshindō studio. Anonymous. 1875-6. 24 folios. 24x17.5 cm. Coloured drawings. Acquired June 1988.

Or.14477 *Nyūboku koanjō* 入木古案帖

Calligraphic scroll by Sugiyama Hōun 杉山法雲. 1702 [Genroku 15]. 1 scroll consisting of 14.5 sheets each 24.6x35.5 cm. Paper decorated with designs of flowers and grasses in gold and silver. Acquired June 1988.

Or.14478 *Sanpitsu soga* 三筆龜画

Collection of sketches by Eiryō Eikō 永了英興, Eishū Tenshun 栄州典俊 and Yōi 養意. 1772. 35 folios. 35 illustrations, mostly in *sumi*, some coloured. 27.4x18.9 cm. Acquired June 1988.

Or.14480 *Series of 7 documents connected with the physician Engelbert Kaemfer (1651-1715)*

Or.14480/1 *Deshima monkan* 出島門間. Pass allowing access to the island of Deshima probably issued for Kaemfer's servant. 1692. 1 sheet. 13.0x7.7 cm.

Or.14480/2 *Ukejō no koto* 請状之事. Written guarantee from Irako Yajirō 伊良子弥次郎 to the official in charge of Deshima for the good conduct of Imamura Gen'emon 今村源右衛門 (1671-1736), Kaempfer's servant. Annotations in Kaempfer's hand. 1692. 1 sheet 33.5x46 cm.

Or.14480/3 *Dai Nihon nengōzu* 大日本年号図. List of era names from 641 to 1688 with dates in western calendar added by Kaempfer. 1690-1692. 1 sheet 46.0x60.0 cm.

Or.14480/4 *Deyaparuma no kōnōsho* テ`ヤパ`ルマの効能書. Description of the effects of a diapalma plaster, a European treatment favoured by Kaempfer. 1690-1692. 1 sheet 14.0x17.0 cm.

Or.14480/5 *Practice sheet of Japanese characters*

Practice sheet of Japanese characters (*kanji*) with corrections and pronunciations added. A later English annotation (by Sloane ?) reads "A vocabulary". 1690-1692. 1 sheet 24x32 cm.

Or.14480/6 & Or.14480/7 *Lists of officials*

Lists of names of various Bakufu officials. 1690-1692. 2 sheets.

Acquired as part of the Kaempfer collections by Sir Hans Sloane 1723-5.

Or.14566 *Woodblocks for advertisements*

Five woodblocks used for printing advertisements for various medicinal preparations. Ōsaka, mid 19th century.

Or.14720 *Yoshiwara jūnitoki emaki* 吉原十二時繪卷

Picture scroll, with descriptive text, depicting life in the Yoshiwara pleasure quarters of Edo. Copy by Iwamoto Kattōshi 岩本活東子 (real name Iwamoto Sashichi 岩本左七) of the no longer extant original by the celebrated *ukiyo-e* artist Kitao Masayoshi (Keisai) 北尾政美 (蕙齋) (1764-1824) with text by Santō Kyōden 山東京伝 (1761-1816). 1861 [Bunkyū 1]. 1 scroll 26.5x910 cm. 12 colour illustrations. Ownership stamp of the *rangaku* scholar Ōtsuki Bankei 大槻盤溪 (1801-1878). Acquired June 1992.

Or.14755 *Uruga Eisen chaku mitori-zu* 浦賀英船着見取図

Sketches of the British vessel 'The Brothers' which entered Uruga Bay on 17 June 1818 under Captain Peter Gordon. The manuscript is based on observations made by the official party which boarded the vessel and depicts members of the crew, their weapons, furniture and personal possessions. 1818 [Bunsei 1]. *Orihon* album (13 leaves) 27x33.5 cm. 11 colour illustrations. Acquired November 1992.

Or.14756 *Sanjūrokkasen zu* 三十六歌仙図

Nanga-style scroll depicting the 36 Poetic Geniuses illustrated by Yokoi Kinkoku 横井金谷 (1761-1832). c.1801-1804 [Kyōwa Period]. 1 scroll 22.5x314 cm. 36 partly coloured ink drawings. Acquired November 1992.

Or.14819 *Certificate conferring Order of the Rising Sun on Admiral von Bendemann*

Letters patent bearing the signature and seal of Emperor Mutsuhito [Meiji] conferring the Grand Cordon of the Order of the Rising Sun on Admiral Felix von Bendemann (1848-1915), Commander of the German Cruiser Squadron in the Far East during the Boxer Rebellion. Dated The Imperial Palace, Tokyo, 8 May 1906. 1 sheet 45x58.5 cm. Acquired June 1993.

Or.14871 *Kaikikan* 瑰琦観

Album of paintings and poems by eminent Nanga and Shijō school artists and poets in the Kyoto/Osaka region including Rosetsu 蘆雪 (1754-99). Kyoto/Osaka. c.1807 [Bunka 4]. *Orihon* album (35 leaves) 24.5x17.5 cm. Lights colours and ink on paper. Folios edged with flecks of gold and silver. Acquired March 1994

Or.14872 *Yoshida Seisai-ō juga no tame Ōkubo Shibutsu sensei hoka gojūmei shoga* 為吉田静斎翁寿賀大窪詩佛先生外五拾名書画

Handscroll compiled in celebration of the 80th birthday of Yoshida Seisai containing poems, calligraphy and drawings by 50 contributors including Ō kubo Shibutsu 大窪詩佛 (1767-1837). 27 illustrations including cranes, tortoises, bamboo and other symbols of longevity by Tani Bunchō 谷文晁 (1763-1840) and other Nanga/Shijō style artists. 1818 [Bunsei 1]. 1 scroll 30x2070 cm. Light colours and ink on paper. Acquired March 1994.

Or.14873 *Anzu senryū* 按図選龍

Albums of paintings and poems by Shijō, Maruyama and Nanga artists from the Edo and Kyoto-Osaka areas. ca. 1833; an illustration by Ki Hironari 紀広成 (1777-1839) is dated 1833 [Tenpō 4] and another is signed by Hara Zaichū 原在中 (1750-1837) aged 84. 2 *orihon* albums 24.5x20 cm. 23 colour and ink illustrations on silk. Acquired March 1994

Or.14947 *Sakokuron* 鎖国論

Manuscript copy of the work on Japan's policy of national isolation by Engelbert Kaempfer (1651-1716). Translated into Japanese from the Dutch version published in 1729. 1801 [Kyōwa 1]. 2 volumes. 28x18.1 cm. Acquired July 1994.

Or.14948 [*Nagasaki Eiryōjikan kyūzō komonjo makimono* 長崎英領事館旧蔵古文書巻物]

Letter from the governor (*bugyō*) of Nagasaki Takahashi Mimasaka no Kami Kazunuki 高橋美作守和貫 to the British consul Charles Alexander Winchester (1820?-1883) regarding a robbery on a British ship. Dated 28th day 6th month of Bunkyū 2 [24th July 1862]. Note in English at the start of the scroll reads "Recd from governor 24th July 1862". Mounted as a scroll with accompanying notes on its provenance 21x356 cm. Acquired July 1994.

Or.14962 [*Sho-haijin shūshochō* 諸俳人蒐書帳]

"Friendship album" of calligraphy and drawings by noted *haiku* poets and Nanga/Shijō artists including Tani Bunchō 谷文晁 (1763-1840). 19th century. *Orihon* album 63 folios. 24x17 cm. Acquired November 1994.

Or.15028 *Tōkaidō gojūsantsugi manga emaki* 東海道五十三次漫画繪卷

"The fifty-three stages of the Tōkaidō highway in cartoons". Inspired by the series of 55 woodblock prints by Hiroshige these scrolls contain cartoons by 18 artists of the Tōkyō Mangakai (Tokyo Cartoonists Association) including its founder Okamoto Ippei 岡本一平 (1886-1948). The first scroll contains 28 illustrations of the stages from Nihonbashi 日本橋 to Kakegawa 掛川, the second contains 27 illustrations of the stages from Fukuroi 袋井 to Kyoto. 1920. 55 sheets each 24.7x33 cm mounted as 2 scrolls (overall lengths 915 & 948 cm). Ink and colour illustrations in abbreviated comic style. Acquired April 1995.

Or.15169 [Haiku album]

Untitled *Haiku* album with contributions from artists and poets chiefly of the Kansai region. Mid 19th century. 71 folios. 33 ink illustrations (some coloured) of landscapes, human figures, flora and fauna. *Fukurotoji* binding. Acquired November 1995.

Or.15170 [Album of drawings of butterflies]

Untitled album of drawings of butterflies by various artists. ca. 1905. *Orihon* album with 14 leaves. 15.5x20 cm. Ink and colour illustrations on paper. Acquired November 1995.

Or.15171 *Haikai gansen no zu* 俳諧群僊の図

Coloured portraits of the *haiku* poet Matsuo Bashō and his disciples, each with an example of his/her poetry, by Yokoi Kinkoku 横井琴谷 (1761-1832). Early 19th century. 10 sheets (2 joined together) 20.5x16.7 cm. Acquired November 1995.

Or.15219 *Tsukishima* つきしま (築島)

Kōwakamai or ‘story told in dance’ in fine *Nara ehon* style based on an episode in the 6th chapter of “The Tale of the Heike” recounting the foundation of a harbour by the Taira family. Undated but early to mid 17th century. Volume 2 of 3. 20 ff. 7 full page illustrations in gold and colours. *Fukuro-toji* binding in original blue paper covers decorated with reed design in gold. 33.5x24.5 cm. Acquired April 1996.

Or.15375 *Myōhōrengekyō Kanzeon bosatsu fumonbon* 妙法蓮華經觀世音菩薩普門品

Chapter 25 of the Lotus Sutra. Title on box *Ichiji sanrei Kannonkyō* 一字三禮觀音經. 1688 [Genroku 1]. 1 scroll 12x155 cm. Gold ink on indigo-dyed paper. Brocade cover and wooden box. Acquired March 1997

Or.15386 *Chōjō kikan* 暢情寄感

Scroll of paintings and Chinese poems by Rai San’yō 頼三陽 (1780-1832) and his literati circle completed at a farewell party for Naitō Seishū 内藤静修 (1757-1834) on the occasion of his departure from Kyoto to Chōshū. Kyoto, 1822 [Bunsei 5]. 1 scroll 30.5x 950cm. 6 illustrations in ink on paper. Acquired July 1997.

Or.15393 *Meisho jūgoshu waka emaki* 名所十五首和歌絵巻

Scroll containing 15 poems on famous sights in Japan from the anthology *Kenpō meisho hyakushu* 建保名所百首 of 1215 copied by high ranking courtiers including Dōkō Hōshinnō 道晃法親王 (1612-1678), brother of Emperor Go-Mizunoo 後水尾天皇, and Ryōshō Hōshinnō 良尚法親王 (1623-1698), nephew of Emperor Go-Yōzei 後陽成. Poems interspersed with paintings attributed to Kanō Tan’yū 狩野探幽 (1602-1674). 1665 [Kanbun 5]. 1 scroll 25.5x750 cm, silk mounted on paper. 15 ink and pale colour illustrations; gold borders top and bottom. Acquired November 1997.

Or.15394 [Tanomura Chikuden *gajō* 田野村竹田画帖]

Album of 12 landscape paintings by the Nanga artist Tanomura Chikuden 田野村竹田 (1777-1835) each accompanied by a poem by the artist. Paintings dated 1831 (*kanoto u* 辛卯 = Tenpō 2). *Orihon* album with 7 leaves. 33.5x24 cm. 12 paintings colour on silk each 22x17 cm mounted on paper decorated with gold flakes. Brocade cover. Acquired November 1997.

Or.15429 *Shikie utaawase maki* 四季絵歌合巻

Picture scroll with 44 *waka* poems on the four seasons compiled from various classic anthologies. Each poem accompanied by colour drawing of landscape with figures, flowers or animals. On fine mica paper, endpaper decorated with gold and silver, brocade cover. In paulownia wood box. Genroku Period [1688-1700]. 1 scroll 27.2x1100 cm (made up from 24 sheets each 27.2x44.5 cm). Acquired March 1998.

Or.15430 *Haru[ki] Nanmei sansui gajō* 春[木]南溟山水画帖

Album of water 16 colour landscapes with poems by Haruki Nanmei 春木南溟 (1795-1878). [Edo]. Dated 1845 (*tsuchi no tomi* 己巳 = Kōka 2). *Orihon* album containing 18 leaves 26.2x15.7 cm. Borders decorated with gold flecks. Brocade covers. Acquired January 1997.

Or.15431 *Aobyōshi* 青標紙

Manual for samurai by Matsudaira Etchū no Kami 松平越中守 (possibly Matsudaira Sadanobu 松平定信 (1758-1829)). 1790 [Kansei 2]. 2 volumes (126 folios) bound as one in *fukuro-toji* style 26x18.5 cm. Includes small ink drawings of samurai costume, tattoos and architectural features. British Museum acquisition stamp February 1921.

Or.15432 *Kan'ei Nantō hen* 寛永南寫變

Anonymous account of the events surrounding the Shimabara Rebellion of 1637-8. Undated but possibly 17th century. 2 volumes (48 folios) bound as one in *Yamato-toji* style in a cover of reused paper 25x18 cm. Acquired by OMPB March 1956.

Or.15433 *Three administrative documents relating to the Ise Shrine*

Three documents relating to the personnel and administration of the Grand Shrine at Ise. The grey paper wrapper bears the name Jūshijō Watarai Hiroto no [Kōkyō] Kannushi 從四位上度會弘共神主 and the date 31st December 1763 [27th Day 11 Month Hōreki 13] but the individual documents are earlier. No acquisition date but each has a British Museum green (donation) stamp.

Or.15433/1. Signed by Saishu Shōsanmi Jingi no Taifu Ōnakatomi Ason 祭主正三位神祇大副大中臣朝臣. Dated 11th October 1747 [8th Day 9th Month Enkyō 4]. 1 sheet 35.5x49.5 cm.

Or.15433/2. Signed by Dai[gū]ji Shōshii no ge Jingi no Taifu Ōnakatomi Ason 大[宮]司正四位神祇大副大中臣朝臣. Dated 21st October 1747 [18th Day 9th Month Enkyō 4]. 1 sheet 32.5x45 cm.

Or.15433/3. Signed by nine priests holding the post of *Negi* 禰宜. Dated 20th October 1747 [17th Day 9th Month Enkyō 4]. 1 sheet 32.5x45 cm.

Or.15434 *Chūruī tōzu* 冑類當圖

Anonymous work containing illustrations of helmets made by successive generations of the Myōchin 明珍 dynasty of armourers. Label affixed to front cover reads “The Miochins... with Ernest Hart’s notes”. 19th century. 12 folios. 26.5x18.5 cm. 42 ink illustrations. Resewn *fukuro-toji* binding. British Museum acquisition stamp 12 February 1921.

Or.15435 *Gun'yōki* 軍用記

Manuscript of volume 3 of the illustrated manual of armour, weaponry and other military equipment by Ise Sadatake 伊勢貞丈 (1717-1784). 19th century copy of the work originally published in 1761. Volume 3 of 7. 34 folios. 27.5x19.6 cm. 27 ink illustrations (some coloured). *Fukuro-toji* binding. British Museum acquisition stamp 12 February 1921.

Or.15436/1 [*Chadō*] *sanbyakkajō* [茶道] 三百ヶ條

Anonymous illustrated manual of the tea ceremony and tea house design. Mid-19th century. Volume 2 of 3 only. 37 folios. 27x21 cm. *Sumi* illustrations. *Fukuro-toji* binding. British Museum acquisition stamp 22 March 1956.

Or.15436/2 *Chadō seidenshū shodōgu sunshaku no hō* 茶道正傳集諸道具寸尺之法

Anonymous tea ceremony manual giving diagrams and measurements for the layout of implements involved. Early 19th century. 25 folios. 27.5x18.5 cm. *Fukuro-toji* binding. British Museum acquisition stamp 22 March 1956.

Or.15436/3 *Tansu okiawase dō tatesama no koto* 箆笥置合同立様之事

Copy of a tea ceremony manual by Takeuchi Tsunetoyo 竹内経豊 with diagrams of how to lay out the implements involved. Early 19th century copy of a work manuscript dated 1693 [Genroku 6]. 75 folios. Some diagrams. 26x19.5 cm. British Museum acquisition stamp 22 March 1956.

Or.15436/4 *Cha kabuki no shiki* 茶カフキ之式

Anonymous tea ceremony manual. Early 19th century. 9 folios. 24.3x18.1 cm. British Museum acquisition stamp 22 March 1956.

Or.15436/5 *Roji ireyuku tsukuru aida kokoroe no koto* 露地入行つくる間心得之事

Anonymous work on the tea ceremony. Early 19th century. 25 folios. 24.3x18.1 cm. British Museum acquisition stamp 22 March 1956.

Or.15436/6 *Senke tōryū hidensho chadō kakoi shōzashiki tanden shiki* 千家當流秘傳書茶道圍小座敷炭傳式

Illustrated work on the layout of tea houses and their hearths. 1807 [Bunka 4]. 27 folios. Ink illustrations. 23x17 cm. British Museum acquisition stamp 22 March 1956.

Or.15436/7 *Chadō kikigaki* 茶道聞書

Anonymous work on the tea ceremony. Early 19th century. 22 folios. 24.3x18 cm. British Museum acquisition stamp 22 March 1956.

Or.15437 [Set of maps of Edo]

Set of anonymous coloured maps of the city of Edo. Mid 19th century. 26 sheets. British Museum acquisition stamp 8 November 1893.

Or.15438 [Map of Satsuma 佐津間]

Anonymous coloured map of the area around Satsuma Castle in what is now Kamagaya City 鎌ヶ谷市 in Chiba Prefecture. Mid 19th century. 1 sheet 130x130cm (32x22 cm folded). British Museum acquisition stamp 6 November 1893.

Or.15512 *Kokoro no sōshi* ころのそうし

Satire on the hypocrisy of human nature written by Matsudaira Sadanobu 松平定信 (1758-1829), author of the Kansei Reforms, following his fall from influence. Hand-coloured picture scroll containing illustrations by Takezawa Yokei (d. 1808) of courtiers, ministers etc. with their thoughts depicted in cartoon form. In a paulownia wood box. Preface dated 1802 [Kyōwa 3]. 1 scroll 30x950 cm. Acquired November 1998.

Or.15513 *Zoku fude no ayumi* 続筆酒安由美

Travel diary by Kariho Akinari 荻穂秋成 covering famous sights of Ise, the Tōkaidō, Kiso, Harima and Kii. 1845 [Kōka 2]. 5 volumes 23.5x16.5 cm. Volume 1 contains a water colour of two travellers resting at a tea house. Acquired November 1998.

Or.15514 *Seisen hisshō taisei kōyō manga* 聖戦必勝態勢昂揚漫画

‘Cartoons on the victorious sacred war’. An album with humorous watercolour sketches on World War II, the Greater East Asian Co-Prosperty Sphere etc which were exhibited in an exhibition organised by the New Japan Cartoonists Association 新日本漫画家協会. Artists include Okamoto Ippei 岡本一平 (1886-1948), Shimizu Kon 清水崑 (1912-1974), Tanaka Hisara 田中比左良 (1890-1974) and Miyao Shigeo 宮尾しげお (1902-1982). c.1942. 14 out of a total of 15 sheets each 33x45.4 cm loose mounted in an *orihon* album 35x50cm. Acquired November 1998.

Or.15525 *Shintoku* 辰徳

Kanji calligraphy in epigraphic style by Arai Kōfū 新井光風 (1937-). c.1997. 1 sheet mounted in metal frame. Framed dimensions 102.5x180 cm. Donated April 1998. (Displayed in The British Library Conference Centre).
