Sweden is a constitutional monarchy. The King is the Head of State; however, his duties are primarily of a representative and ceremonial nature. The monarch opens the sessions of the Riksdag, is the official representative of Sweden in relations with other countries, receives other Heads of State, and holds the highest military rank.

The Riksdag (Parliament) is the highest organ of government. Since 1971 it has one Chamber with 349 members elected on a system of partial proportional representation and is led by a Speaker. The members are chosen every four years in general elections and at present they represent seven parties. The Riksdag enacts laws, decides on taxes and on budget allocations, and examines the administration of the country by the executive branch.

1. PARLIAMENTARY PUBLICATIONS

The Swedish Parliament (Riksdag) makes laws and decrees the income taxes and expenditure of the state. It reviews the work of the government and the various authorities and decides on foreign policy. The Riksdag maintains a website at <http://www.riksdagen.se/> which offers information about its work and decisions. The website contains a large number of texts from the parliament such as government bills (propositioner), debates (protokoll) and committee reports (utskottsbetänkanden). The website is easy to use but the texts are in Swedish with some guides in English. Records of proceedings in the Chamber can be searched online in Swedish from 1971 at

Protokoll (Records of proceedings in the Chamber)

This series contains a verbatim record of everything that is said in the Riksdag Chamber. Immediately after a meeting of the Chamber, the proceedings can be read in a preliminary record; after two to four weeks, the final, the approved record is published. The record also shows how the parties have voted.

Parliamentary working papers used to appear in *Protokoll: Riksdagen, Bihang* (Appendix to the Proceedings) and include bills, motions, the royal speech at the opening of Parliament, annual reports of several parliamentary offices, reports of parliamentary committees and reports requested from the Government by Parliament.

The Ombudsmen of Justice, or the Parliamentary Ombudsmen to give them their official title, are elected by the Swedish Riksdag (Parliament) to ensure that public authorities and their staff comply with the laws and other statutes governing their actions. The Ombudsmen exercise this supervision by evaluating and investigating complaints from the general public, by making inspections of the various authorities and by conducting other forms of inquiry that they initiate themselves. Anyone who feels that they have

received unfair treatment by a public agency can lodge a complaint with the Parliamentary Ombudsmen (JO). They exist to guarantee that the treatment of all individuals by public agencies is in accordance with Swedish law.

2. CONSTITUTION

Like most other democracies, Sweden has a written Constitution which sets out the rules for political decision-making. Instead of one document, Sweden has four fundamental laws which serve as a basis for how Sweden is ruled:

- The Instrument of Government
- The Act of Succession,
- The Freedom of the Press Act
- The Fundamental Law on Freedom of Expression.

3.2 The courts and case law

There are three kinds of courts in Sweden: the general courts, which comprise district courts, courts of appeal and the Supreme Court; the general administrative courts, that is to say, county administrative courts, administrative courts of appeal and the Supreme Administrative Court; and also the special courts, which determine disputes within special areas, for example, the Labour Court and the Market Court.

Neither the Government Offices nor any other agencies have the authority to decide how a court rules in individual cases. The National Courts Administration is the central administrative agency for public courts, public administrative courts, regional tenancy tribunals, regional rent tribunals and the National Legal Aid Authority.

Case law from the Supreme Court, the Appeal Courts, the Supreme Administrative Court, the Administrative Courts of Appeal and specialised courts have all been published electronically and free of charge by Sveriges Domstolar (the National Courts Administration) since 1980 at <http://www.domstol.se/>. 7. NATIONAL BANK PUBLICATIONS

The Riksbank is Sweden's central bank and an authority under the Riksdag, the Swedish parliament. The Riksbank's main tasks are to maintain price stability and to promote a safe and efficient payment system.

The Riksbank compiles and publishes statistics within a number of different areas. The balance of payments, including the current account and financial account, is presented quarterly. The Riksbank also compiles data regarding banks' and housing credit institutions' deposit and lending rates. Financial market statistics, including the interest rate data, are published by Statistics Sweden monthly on behalf of the Riksbank. 10.4 Censuses

The libraries hold a significant collection of historic Swedish censuses.

Sweden's first census was conducted in 1749. Sweden got its first nominal census in 1860 in connection with a new reporting system and the establishment of the Central Bureau of Statistics. Between 1860 and 1930 censuses were taken every ten years. Since 1930 population and housing censuses have been taken every 5 years in years ending 0 and 5. In earlier population and housing censuses the general public and property owners have had to provide information by filling in and sending in questionnaires. It has, however, in recent censuses been possible to use increasing amounts of information from administrative register-based sources. Future censuses from 2005 onwards will be based entirely on information from different administrative sources. This means that the general public will not be required to fill in questionnaires every five years, nor, from now on, will property owners have to provide information about the buildings and dwellings that they own.
