# Personal names

## From the RDA glossary:

---

**Person**

An individual or an identity established by an individual (either alone or in collaboration with one or more other individuals).

---

# Personal names

## Persons include:

- Pseudonyms and joint pseudonyms
- Spirits
- Persons named in sacred scriptures
- Fictitious and legendary persons
- Real non-human entities

All these entities are now established on the name authority file

LCSH for fictitious and non-human persons will be cancelled

# Authorized Access Points

(RDA 9.19)

From the RDA glossary:

---

**Authorized Access Point**

The standardized access point representing an entity.

---

# Authorized Access Points

(*RDA 9.19*)

- The basis for the Authorized Access Point (heading) is the Preferred Name
- Additions are made to the Preferred Name  
(*RDA 9.19.1.2-9.19.1.6*)
- Coded 100 in MARC 21

## Preferred Name for the Person (RDA 9.2.2)

From the RDA glossary:

---

<b>Preferred Name for the Person</b>	The name or form of name chosen to identify the person. It is also the basis for the authorized access point representing that person.

## Preferred Name for the Person (*RDA 9.2.2*)

- Form by which a person is commonly known
- From sources in this order of priority:

Preferred sources of information in associated resources

Other formal statements appearing in associated resources

Other sources, including reference sources



## Preferred Name for the Person (RDA 9.2.2)

### Duke of Wellington [*not* Arthur Wellesley]



In 1814 Wellesley was granted the title *Duke of Wellington*, by which he is most commonly known

The preferred name should be the most-commonly-known form of the name (RDA 9.2.2):

- ◆ real name
- ◆ pseudonym
- ◆ title of nobility
- ◆ nickname
- ◆ initials
- ◆ other appellation

- 100 1 \$a Presley, Elvis, \$d 1935-1977 \$c (Spirit)
- 100 0 \$a Cher, \$d 1946-
- 100 1 \$a Smith, Joseph, \$c Jr., \$d 1805-1844
- 100 0 \$a Elizabeth \$b II, \$c Queen of Great Britain, \$d 1926-
- 100 1 \$a Domino, Fats, \$d 1928-
- 100 0 \$a H. D. , \$d active 1583
- 100 1 \$a Fraser, Caroline \$c (Photographer)

## Preferred Name for the Person (RDA 9.2.2)

### Recording the Preferred Name (RDA 9.2.2.4)

- Record as the first element that part of the name under which the person would normally be listed in authoritative alphabetic lists in his or her language or country of residence or activity, followed by other parts of the name.

#### *Exception*

- If a person's preference is known to be different from the normal usage, follow that preference in selecting the part of the name to be recorded as the first element.

## Preferred Name for the Person (*RDA 9.2.2*)

### Different forms: Fullness (*RDA 9.2.2.5.1*)

- Choose the most commonly found form as the preferred name
- If no predominant form, choose the latest form as the preferred name
- Record the other forms as variant names (MARC 21 field 400)

## Preferred Name for the Person (RDA 9.2.2)

### Different forms: Language (RDA 9.2.2.5.2)

- Choose the form in the language most commonly found in resources associated with the person as the preferred name
- Record the other forms as variant names (MARC 21 field 400)

#### *Exceptions*

- Greek or Latin - choose the form most commonly found in reference sources
- Given name - choose the well-established form of name in reference sources in the language preferred by the agency creating the data

## Preferred Name for the Person (*RDA 9.2.2*)

### Different forms: Non-preferred Script (*RDA 9.2.2.5.3*)

- Authorized access points are recorded in Roman script
- Follow the ALA-LC Romanization Tables: Transliteration Schemes for Non-Roman Scripts
- Non-Roman script forms may be recorded as Variant Names (MARC field 400)

## Preferred Name for the Person (RDA 9.2.2)

### Change of Name (RDA 9.2.2.7)

- Choose the latest name or form of name as the preferred name

#### *Exception*

- Choose an earlier name if it is better known

Caroline Kennedy

*(better known than name after marriage: Caroline Kennedy Schlossberg)*

## Preferred Name for the Person (RDA 9.2.2)

### More Than One Identity (RDA 9.2.2.8)

- Choose the name associated with each identity as the preferred name for that identity
- If an individual uses only one pseudonym and does not use his or her real name, choose the pseudonym as the preferred name
- Record the real name as a variant (MARC 21 field 400)

## Preferred Name for the Person (RDA 9.2.2)

### Compound Surnames (RDA 9.2.2.10)

- A compound surname consists of two or more proper names separated by either a space or a hyphen
- First element determined by the established usage or the preference of the person
- If not known, follow:

*Names of Persons: National Usages for Entry in Catalogues, 4th revised and enlarged edition*

## Preferred Name for the Person (RDA 9.2.2)

### Surnames with Separately Written Prefixes (RDA 9.2.2.11)

- First element determined by the usage of the person's language
- See Appendix F for additional guidance

100 1 \$a Van Valkenburg, Jeroen	(Afrikaans)
100 1 \$a Maupassant, Guy de	(French)

- Record in direct order

\$b t.p. (by A.B.C.D.E.)

100 0 \$a **D. S.**, \$c Master, \$d active 1505-1511

670 \$a North Eastern main line steam, 1981? \$b t.p. (61648)

# Variant Name for the Person

(RDA 9.2.3)

From the RDA glossary:

---

**Variant Name for the Person**

A name or form of name by which a person is known that differs from the name or form of name chosen as the preferred name.

---



## Variant Name for the Person (*RDA 9.2.3*)

- Name or form of name not chosen as the preferred name
- Found in resources associated with the person and/or in reference sources
- Record following cataloguer judgement
- Coded 400 in MARC 21

# Title or Other Designation Associated with the Person (RDA 9.19.1.2)

## From the RDA glossary:

---

**Title of the Person**

A word or phrase indicative of royalty, nobility, or ecclesiastical rank or office, a term of address for a person of religious vocation, or another term indicative of rank, honour, or office.

**Other Designation Associated  
with the Person**

A term other than a title that is associated with a person's name.

## Title or Other Designation Associated with the Person (RDA 9.19.1.2)

*Always added:*

*Titles:*

- A title of royalty, nobility, or religious rank

*Other designations:*

- The terms *Saint* and *Spirit*
- The terms *Fictitious character*, *Legendary character*, etc.
- Terms for persons named in sacred scriptures
- Terms indicating type, species or breed of a real non-human entity
- Profession or occupation

*(for a name not conveying the idea of a person)*

## Title or Other Designation Associated with the Person (RDA 9.19.1.2)

### *Examples*

#### *Titles:*

## Date of Birth and/or Death

(RDA 9.19.1.3)

### From the RDA glossary:

---

**Date of Birth**

The year a person was born. Date of birth may also include the month or month and day of the person's birth.

---

**Date of Death**

The year a person died. Date of death may also include the month or month and day of the person's death.

## Date of Birth and/or Death (RDA 9.19.1.3)

*(RDA 9.19.1.2, LC-PCC-PS for 9.19.1.1)*

Added to distinguish between access points

Apply the option to add even if not needed for this purpose

### ■ Style:

1920-2012

(born 1920, died 2012)

1833-

(born 1833)

-1970

(died 1970)

approximately 1930-

(born approximately 1930)

## Date of Birth and/or Death (RDA 9.19.1.3)

### *Examples*

100 1 \$a Smith, John, \$d 1978-

100 1 \$a Smith, John, \$d 1718-1791

100 1 \$a Smith, John, \$d -1773

100 1 \$a Smith, John, \$d approximately 1787-

*Use a hyphen after the date of birth (LC-PCC-PS for 9.3.2.3)*

*Use a hyphen before the date of death (LC-PCC-PS for 9.3.3.3)*

## Fuller Form of Name (RDA 9.19.1.4)

From the RDA glossary:

---

**Fuller Form of Name**

The full form of a part of a name represented only by an initial or abbreviation in the form chosen as the preferred name, or a part of the name not included in the form chosen as the preferred name.

---

## Fuller Form of Name (RDA 9.19.1.4)

(RDA 9.19.1.4)

Added to distinguish between access points

Apply the option to add selectively, if this helps to identify the person

- Add expansions of initials if this helps to identify the person:

100 1 \$a Smith, J. \$q (**James**)

- But add unused forenames only to distinguish:

100 1 Smith, James \$q (**James Alan**)

# Period of Activity of the Person

(RDA 9.19.1.5)

From the RDA glossary:

---

**Period of Activity of the Person** A date or range of dates indicative of the period in which a person was active in his or her primary field of endeavour.

---

## Period of Activity of the Person (RDA 9.19.1.5)

- Add to distinguish one access point from another
- Option to add even if there is no need to distinguish

- Style:

active 1900-1920

(active 1900-1920)

active 1743

(active in 1743)

active 18<sup>th</sup> century

(active 18<sup>th</sup> century)

active 16<sup>th</sup> century - 17<sup>th</sup> century

(active 16<sup>th</sup>-17<sup>th</sup> centuries)

## Period of Activity of the Person (RDA 9.19.1.5)

### *Examples*

100 1 \$a Smith, John, \$d **active 1705**

100 1 \$a Smith, John, \$d **active 17<sup>th</sup> century**

100 1 \$a Smith, John, \$d **active 17<sup>th</sup> century - 18<sup>th</sup> century**

*Use “active” and “century” rather than abbreviations “fl.” and “cent.”  
(LC-PCC-PS for 9.3.4.3)*

# Profession or Occupation (RDA 9.19.1.5)

From the RDA glossary:

---

**Profession or Occupation** 2013/07 A person's vocation or avocation.

---



## Profession or Occupation (*RDA 9.19.1.5*)

- A person's job or pursuit
- Can be professional, occupational, unpaid or recreational
- Add to distinguish one access point from another
- Or to a name not conveying the idea of a person
- Option to add even if there is no need to distinguish

## *Examples*

100 1 \$a Niven, William \$c (Clergyman)

100 1 \$a Waters, Chris \$c (Poet)

100 1 \$a Green, Kevin \$c (Angler)

100 0 \$a Big Hand \$c (Musician)

## Other Term of Rank, Honour or Office (RDA 9.19.1.6)

### From the RDA glossary:

---

**Title of the Person**

A word or phrase indicative of royalty, nobility, or ecclesiastical rank or office, a term of address for a person of religious vocation, or another term indicative of rank, honour, or office.

- *Other Term of Rank, Honour or Office* is a sub-element of *Title of the Person*

## Other Term of Rank, Honour or Office (RDA 9.19.1.6)

(9.19.1.6)

- Terms indicating academic office
- Terms of respect for clergy
- Terms indicating military rank
- Other terms of honour that are not noble titles

## Other Term of Rank, Honour or Office (RDA 9.19.1.6)

- Add to distinguish one authorized access point from another:

1001 \$a Wood, John, \$c **Captain**

1001 \$a Young, Thomas, \$c **Rev.**

1001 \$a Bishop, Paul, \$c **Professor**

- Option to add even if there is no need to distinguish

1001 \$a Appleby, Robert, \$c **Sir**

## Other Term of Rank, Honour or Office (*RDA 9.19.1.6*)

- Does not include terms that indicate gender or marital status

Such terms are only allowed in two cases:

- Persons Known by a Surname Only  
*RDA 9.2.2.9.3*

1001 \$a Read, \$c **Miss**

- Married Person Identified Only by a Partner's Name  
*RDA 9.2.2.9.4*

1001 \$a Davis, Maxwell, \$c **Mrs.**

## Other Term of Rank, Honour or Office (RDA 9.19.1.6)

- Record terms in the language and form in which they are found
- “Principle of Representation”

1001 \$a White, James, \$c Doctor

1001 \$a Price, Meg, \$c Dr.

1001 \$a Thomas, Jean, \$c docteur

1001 \$a Shishkin, N. I., \$c doktor

1001 \$a Zayn, ‘Alī, \$c al-Duktūr

1001 \$a Polaczek, Stanisław, \$c doc. dr.

- Prefer a full form over an abbreviated form if both are found

## Other Term of Rank, Honour or Office (RDA 9.19.1.6)

- Do not extrapolate fuller forms of titles and terms of address

**Dr.** might stand for Doctor, Docteur, Doktor, etc.;

**Fr.** could stand for Father, but also for Frater, Fray or Frere;

**Prof.** could stand for Professor, Profaisar, Profaisara, Profesar, Profesor, Profesora, Professeur, Professora, etc.

- Record terms in the language and form in which they are found
- “Principle of Representation”



## Other Designation (RDA 9.19.1.7)

### From the RDA glossary:

---

<b>Other Designation Associated with the Person</b>	A term other than a title that is associated with a person's name.

- *Other Designation* is a sub-element of *Other Designation Associated with the Person*

## Other Designation (RDA 9.19.1.7)

*“Record an appropriate designation in the language preferred by the agency creating the data”*

- This element is intentionally broad
- Designed to remove remaining cases when an access point can not be made unique

## Other Designation (RDA 9.19.1.7)

- Any appropriate designation, that is not within the scope of another element that can be used in an access point:

1001 \$a Woods, George \$c (Gentleman)

1001 \$a Jones, William \$c (Defendant)

1001 \$a Budd, Henry \$c (Cree Indian)

1001 \$a Yaśodharā \$c (Wife of Gautama Buddha)

1001 \$a Nichols, Chris \$c (Of the North Oxford Association)

1001 \$a Independent Burgess \$c (Of Nottingham)

## Recording at the Element Level

- Authorized Access Points are required by MARC 21
- Authorized Access Points are required by current systems
- However, RDA is designed to work at the element level
- Linked data (BIBFRAME, etc.)

So

- Future systems may not require Authorized Access Points
- Discretely recorded elements can be retrieved, matched, linked and combined into displays
- Element-level recording is the real substance of the RDA NAR
- Elements are recorded for the present in discrete MARC 21 fields

*Not all RDA elements can be added to the authorized access point*
